

# Reception: Autumn Term 1 & 2 Marvellous Me / Let's Celebrate

**Theme Intent:** We will support a smooth transition from pre-school/home settings into the Reception classes by finding out about ourselves and our families; exploring and developing our own *sense of identity*. We will learn how to form positive new *relationships* and to be able to play cooperatively; becoming **curious** and confident learners. We will try new activities showing **generosity** and **love** towards our peers.
